But woe to those who are pregnant and to those who are nursing babies in those days! Mark 13:19-20 – "For in those days there will be <u>tribulation</u>, such as has not been since the beginning of the creation which God created until this time, nor ever shall be. And unless the Lord had shortened those days, no flesh would be saved; but for the elect's sake, whom He chose, He shortened the days."

Luke 21:22- For these are the days of <u>vengeance</u>, that all things which are written may be fulfilled. - Isaiah 61:1-2, 34:6, 63:1-8, 63:1-6, Revelation 19:11-16

- Tribulation θλῖψις [thlipsis /thlipsis/]: a pressing, pressure, burdens the spirit, to be afflicted, oppression, trouble, suffering, persecution. An oppressive state of physical, mental, social, or economic adversity. To press, squash, hem in, harass, to discomfort
- Vengeance ἐκδίκησις [ekdikesis /ek·dik·ay·sis/]: punishment, giving of justice, the act of meting out justice according to the law

Abomination of Desolation

- Matt 24:9-15 Therefore when you see the 'abomination of desolation,' spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place" (whoever reads, let him understand),
- Daniel 9:27 And on the wing of abominations shall be one who makes desolate,
- Daniel 11:31 And forces shall be mustered by him, and they shall defile the sanctuary fortress; then they shall take away the daily sacrifices, and place there the <u>abomination of desolation</u>.
- Daniel 12:10-12 Many shall be purified, made white, and refined, but the wicked shall do wickedly; and none of the wicked shall understand, but the wise shall understand. "And from the time that the daily sacrifice is taken away, and the <u>abomination of desolation</u> is set up, there shall be one thousand two hundred and ninety days. Blessed is he who waits and comes to the one thousand three hundred and thirty-five days.

Abomination of Desolation

- Abomination שְׁקּוּץ [shiqquwts, shiqquts /shik·koots/]: detested, abhorrence, horror, monster, filth, vile
 - $\beta\delta\epsilon\lambda\nu\gamma\mu\alpha$ [bdelugma /bdel·oog·mah/]: loathsome thing, a horrible thing which defiles
- Desolation コカヴ [shamem /shaw·mame/]: to make uninhabited or deserted; tremble, cause to tremble. To strike with disgust or revulsion.
 - ἐρήμωσις [eremosis /er·ay·mo·sis/]: devastation, the act of causing extensive destruction or utter ruin; a horrible thing which defiles

Great Exploits Daniel 11:32

- Those who do wickedly against the covenant he shall corrupt with flattery; but the people who *know* their God shall be strong, and carry out great exploits.
- •Know "?" [yada '/yaw·dah/]: to know or have knowledge about (someone or something); normally as acquired through observation or the senses.

Everlasting Life Daniel 12:1-4

"At that time Michael shall stand up, The great prince who stands watch over the sons of your people; And there shall be a time of trouble, Such as never was since there was a nation, Even to that time. And at that time your people shall be delivered, Every one who is found written in the book. And many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, Some to everlasting life, Some to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise shall shine Like the brightness of the firmament, And those who turn many to righteousness Like the stars forever and ever. "But you, Daniel, shut up the words, and seal the book until the time of the end; many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall increase."

Preparation for Persecution/Tribulation

- Knowing God's Word
- Abiding faith in Him that results in communication with Him
- Submitting daily to the Holy Spirit
- Knowing that other believers are praying for us
- God uses problems and persecution in our lives:
 - To Direct You (Proverbs 20:30)
 - To Inspect You (James 1:2-3)
 - To Correct You (Psalm 119:71-72)
 - To Protect You (Genesis 50:20)
 - To Perfect You (Romans 5:3-4)
 - God is far more interested in your character than your comfort
